

## Arrouaisian History



### Arrouaisian History

#### Wondering where the name 'Arrouaisian' comes from?


It was William de Missenden, sub-tenant of Walter Giffard (whose father was said to have come to England with William the Conqueror), and lord of the manor of Missenden, who founded Missenden Abbey and invited the canons from St Mary's in Ruisseauville to establish a house of Augustinian canons in 1133. They would follow the customs of the Abbey of St. Nicholas at Arrouaise in Artois. It is likely that some family connection with northern France led William de Missenden to invite these particular canons to Missenden.

For four hundred years small groups of men who had taken religious vows lived and worshipped together on this site according to the Rule of St Augustine.

Missenden Abbey was one of the first Arrouaisian houses in England and the first of the Abbeys to adopt the Arrouasian order of Augustinian canons.

Fast forward to 1985, a major fire burnt down most of the Abbey and so the entire interior was gutted and faithfully restored to its earlier splendour. The Barn Hall situated above the Arrouaisian function room remains to be one of the last parts of the Abbey that survived the fire. The restoration was completed in 1988, when the new building was officially reopened by HRH the Duke of Gloucester.

Today the Arrouaisian, situated in the Coach House and formerly known as the Carrington, consists of a large function area with private bar and a beautiful walled garden area. We honour it's history and are delighted to host conferences, parties and family functions.
